
Catherine de Baillon's Armorial for Her Byzantine Gateway

Catherine de Baillon descends from the imperial Byzantine family of Lascaris through the Franco-Italian Vintimille family. Through this gateway her descendants can trace their descent from a number of Byzantine emperors and notable houses. It is possible to find the arms used by many of her ancestors along this lineage, but unfortunately a few maternal arms are unknown or do not exist.

Paternal Arms Maternal Arms Couple Ī Catherine de **Baillon** and Jacques Miville dit Deschênes, The Mivilles were married 12 November 1669, non-armigerous Notre-Dame de Québec, she was the daughter of: Ш Louise de **Marle** and Alphonse de **Baillon**, sieur of La Mascotterie, married about 1630/1640, Chevreuse region (Yvelines), île de France, she was the daughter of: Anne Bizet and Mathurin de Ш Marle, seigneur of Vaugien, of Ragonant, and of Vacheresse, married around 1610. Chevreuse region, she was the daughter of: IV Marguerite Chabot de Souville and Jean Bizet, seigneur of Paponville (or Raponville), married about 1570/1580, she was the daughter of: Antoine Chabot (or Chabaud), V sieur of La Fond, from Provence, and Catherine **Lombart** (or Lombard), marriage contract, 30 March 1554, Paris, he was the son of:

Theodoros II Dukas **Lascaris**, vice-regent of Asia Minor in 1238, co-emperor in 1241, Roman emperor of the Orient at Nicea on 30 October 1254, crowned in 1255, and Helen of **Bulgaria**, married in the Spring of 1235.

No known arms for house of Asen, the tsars of Bulgaria, in the 13th century

Pierre Miville dit Le Suisse, the father of Jacques Miville dit Deschênes, is not known to have used any arms. His descendants (<u>L'Association Les descendants de Pierre Miville</u>) adopted arms for their group around 1987.
