Catherine de Baillon's descent from Philippe II, *Auguste*, King of France, can be illustrated for every generation through the arms of her ancestors. She was a young noble lady who settled in New France in 1669. Many Americans and Canadians with roots in Québec can claim descent from her.

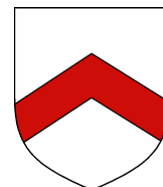
Isabelle de **Ghistelles** and Arnould VI de **Gavre**, baron of Escornaix, married about 1380/1390, she was the daughter of:



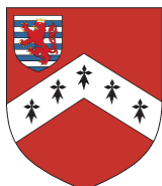

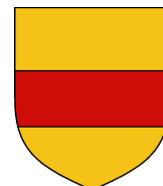

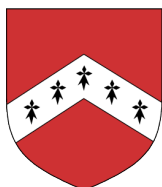
