Catherine de Baillon's descent from Philippe II, *Auguste*, King of France, can be illustrated for every generation through the arms of her ancestors. She was a young noble lady who settled in New France in 1669. Many Americans and Canadians with roots in Québec can claim descent from her.

Jean Le Bouteillier, seigneur of ۷I La Bouteillerie, of Roquemont, and of Vaux-sur-Orge and of La Boissière, and Marie de Venois, married about 1480/1490, he was the son of: Guy II Le Bouteillier, seigneur VII of La Boiuteillerie and of La Roche-Guyon, and Isabeau Morhier, married about 1450, he was the son of: Catherine de Gavre VIII d'Escornaix, dame of Vauxsur-Orge and of La Boissière, and Guy I Le Bouteillier, seigneur of La Bouteillerie and of La Roche-Guyon, married after April 1419, about 1425, she was the daughter of: Isabelle de Ghistelles and IX Arnould VI de Gavre, baron of Escornaix, married about 1380/1390, she was the daughter of: Roger de Ghistelles, seigneur X of Dudzeele and of Straten, and Marguerite, dame of **Dudzeele**, married in or a little before 1357, he was the son of: ΧI Jean IV, seigneur of Ghistelles, and Marie de Haverskerke. dame of Straten, married a little after June 1337, he was the son of: Marguerite de Luxembourg XII and Jean III, seigneur of Ghistelles, married 1284 avant juin 1289
