

Just Meo DuLong: My Grandfather's Given Name

You would think that an accomplished genealogist would know the given name of his paternal grandfather with confidence, but as a matter of fact I do not. My grandfather died in 1926 and I was born in 1954 so I could not ask him his name. My father, Joseph Leo DuLong, told me his father's name was Meo DuLong. However, Meo is not a common name among Franco-Americans. I assumed it must be a nickname. Early in my research I combined several clues and suggested that his real name was Emile Eldred DuLong. I see this copied now across the Internet, but with no explanation. This little essay will review all the instances where Meo's name is mentioned and will reconsider what is mostly likely his real given name.¹

The easiest solution to this problem would be to find Meo's birth record, but no such record has ever been found at the Houghton County Courthouse. Nor has a baptism record been located. From his death certificate we know that he was born on 20 December 1871 in Calumet, Houghton Co., Michigan. He was of French-Canadian ancestry and his parents, Edward DuLong and Elise Mercier, were Catholic. Unfortunately, the parish of Sacred Heart in Calumet, which opened in 1868, does not hold his baptism record. The parish registers for St. Louis and Ste. Anne French Catholic churches in Calumet did not open until 1883 and 1901 respectively.²

Meo's name appears in many records and the following table lists those name variations I have located in original records:

¹ Meo's brothers also used nicknames in America. Uncle Odilon, baptized 23 Mar. 1861, St-Roch-de-l'Achigan, as Joseph Roch Odilon, was called Zella, and Uncle Élisée, baptized 30 May 1859m St-Roch-de-l'Achigan, as Édouard Élisée, was known as Eli.

² The parish registers for the closed parishes of Ste. Anne and St. Louis can be found at St. Paul the Apostle, the former St. Joseph, which was a Slovene or Austrian Catholic parish in Calumet. I checked these records in person for Dulong and I had a search conducted for me in the Sacred Heart parish register.

³ I believe my father had Leo Ellsworth scratched out and his name Joseph Leo added to his birth certificate. He told me he never used Ellsworth.

⁴ Meo was briefly jailed in 1911 and his wife, Julia Bourbonnais, attempted to have him declared insane. Her petition claimed that he "threatens to kill different members of the family and is unreasonably jealous of his wife." Although her attempt to have him committed failed, her accusation reflects what I heard from my father, Uncle

Irving, and Aunt Priscilla regarding Meo's temperament. He was "insanely jealous" of his wife and often cruel to his children. He is my grandfather, but certainly not a man I admire.

A few points to consider:

- Unless otherwise indicated, all these events occurred in Houghton Co., Michigan, in the Copper Country.
- The surname DuLong is seen in these records as Dulong, DuLong, and Du Long. My father always told me to spell the name as DuLong, but I have noticed he sometimes singed using Dulong. In Québec the surname is most often seen as Dulong. In proper French, if indeed the L is to be capitalized, then Du Long with a space would be appropriate. Richard Dulong, the first of our name in New France, spelled his surname as du Long. I follow my father’s advice and use DuLong.
- Notice that the baptism given names of Meo’s children were not the names that they eventually went by in life. Also, it was customary among French-Canadian families to give the name Joseph to the boys and Marie to the girls in honor of the holy family. You can see this custom in some of the baptism records. As adults, Joseph and Marie was dropped.
- One might wonder if Meo was just a proper name and not a nickname at all. I have been unable to find it listed in any book of given names I have consulted.⁵ Moreover, there is no Saint Meo and the Catholic church was not fond of baptizing children with names other than those of a saint.⁶ Meo can be a nickname for the Italian version of Bartholomew, that is, Bartolomeo, but in French the name would be Barthélemy and not lend itself to being corrupted as Meo. Another possibility is that it is a corruption of Romeo, a name used in French Canada. However, I have seen no evidence for that name being associated with Meo.

The frequency distribution of the names for Meo are found in the following table:

The table shows that about 64 percent of the time his name appears he went by Meo. If you add the near variations of Meo (Eldage Meo, Mayo, Meo E., Meor, Mio, and Neo), then the count rises to 84 percent. This analysis includes documents made out before and after his death.

Many years ago, when researched the baptism records of his children preserved at St. Paul Catholic church in Calumet, I noticed that overtime his name was recorded as Emil then Milio or Mileo and finally as Meo. Furthermore, at his marriage he is recorded with the Spanish version of Emil, namely Emilio. From these facts I deduced that his given name must have been Emil or Emile in French and that over time this was corrupted to become the nickname Meo.

Likewise, I believed that Eldage was indeed his middle name and a corruption of the French name Eldège or Aldège.⁷ I suspected that he Americanized it to Eldred when he named his eldest son. Therefore, I concluded that his name must have been Emile Eldred with a nickname of Meo, hence the Emile Eldred “Meo” DuLong. I shared this naming pattern with some cousins and over the years it has spread online. Nevertheless, in my notes in RootsMagic database, I see I stated: “Please understand that this is a compromise that will have to surrender to better documentation if it is ever found.”

Unfortunately, given the lack of a birth or baptism record for Meo I am unable confirm his given name at birth. Should any of my cousins have evidence of his given name that I have not seen please contact me with this data and I will adjust this report.⁸

Conclusion: I think the best way to record my grandfather’s name in any genealogy is simply Meo DuLong. This is the name he is most often found under, the name he used for his signature, and the name his children most often used for him. Lastly, his tombstone in Lakeview Cemetery near Calumet reads simply: “Meo 1871-1926.” Recording his name as Emile Eldred “Meo” DuLong is going beyond the available evidence, he was just Meo DuLong.

Now you should justifiably believe that I will go through my webpages and my RootsMagic genealogy database and modify all instances of Emile Eldred “Meo” and change it to just Meo. However, I must warn you that I am notoriously slow at updating my webpages and RootsMagic. I am simply not a good data entry clerk. I would rather write a report like this then spend hours repairing my data.
